NEC provides culturally relevant education and training for Indigenous Peoples to pursue career aspirations and enhance academic goals in alignment with their diverse cultural identities and traditional knowledge.

The program is currently seeking an online casual instructor for the following courses: ILS 100 Introduction to Land Stewardship; ILS 110 Academic English; ILS 120 Indigenous Environmental Knowledge; ILS 130 Ecosystems; ILS 140 Climate Crisis Strategies; ILS 150 Indigenous Governance, Law and the Environment; ILS 160 Contemporary Issues in Indigenous Land Stewardship; ILS 170 Leadership & Project Management; ILS 180 Field Studies Contemporary Indigenous Mapping; ILS 190 Field Studies Community Based Planning.

The purpose of the online instructor is to lead our students in a virtual setting over Moodle, MS Teams, and email during defined office hours. Provide the delivery of courses using an Indigenous lens, cultural authenticity, assist with curriculum development, meet with students by MS Teams or phone, facilitating group discussions, including teaching, tutoring, feedback and grading in compliance with NEC standards. The instructor will utilize our Moodle Learning platform to deliver video lectures, upload and assign reading materials, and administer quizzes and tests.
